ORDER OF REINSTATEMENT

On March 26, 2025, Tri-County Hearing Panel #57 entered an Order of Suspension (By Consent) in this matter suspending respondent from the practice of law in Michigan for 179 days, effective October 8, 2024. On April 9, 2025, respondent filed an affidavit pursuant to MCR 9.123(A), attesting that he has fully complied with all requirements of the panel's order and will continue to comply with the order until and unless reinstated. Also on April 9, 2025, the Board was informed by counsel for the Administrator that they have no objection to respondent's reinstatement on the grounds set forth in MCR 9.123(A); and the Board being otherwise advised;

NOW THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED that respondent, Justin Blair Miller, P 66930, is **REINSTATED** to the practice of law in Michigan, effective **Wednesday, April 9, 2025**.

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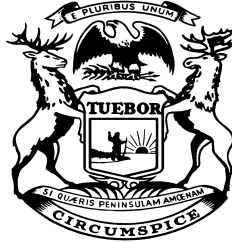
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NOTICE OF SUSPENSION
(By Consent)

Suspension - 179 Days, Effective October 8, 2024

Respondent and the Grievance Administrator filed a Stipulation for Consent Order of a 179-Day Suspension, in accordance with MCR 9.115(F)(5), which was approved by the Attorney Grievance Commission and accepted by Tri-County Hearing Panel #57. The stipulation contained respondent's admission that he was convicted on October 8, 2024, by guilty plea of one count of Operating While Intoxicated - 3rd Offense, a felony, in violation of MCL/PACC Code 257-6256(D), in *State of Michigan v Justin Blair Miller*, 57th Circuit Court, Case No. 2024-0000005679-FH. In accordance with MCR 9.120(B)(1), respondent's license to practice law in Michigan was automatically suspended, effective October 8, 2024, the date of respondent's conviction.

Based on respondent's admission and the stipulation of the parties, the panel found that respondent engaged in conduct that violated a criminal law of a state or of the United States, an ordinance, or tribal law pursuant to MCR 2.615, in violation of MCR 9.104(5).

The panel ordered that respondent's license to practice law in Michigan be suspended for 179 days, effective October 8, 2024, the date of respondent's automatic interim suspension from the practice of law in Michigan for his felony conviction. Costs were assessed in the amount of \$855.27.
